Master Plan Objectives

- NRS 543.596 requires that flood control master plans be reviewed and updated every 5 years
- The purpose of the Master Plan Update (MPU) is to add new information, assess progress, identify obstacles, and recommend changes
- Original plan adopted in 1990, subsequent MPUs adopted in 1995, 2001, 2007, 2012 and 2017



Master Plan Process

- Field investigations
- Data collection & review
- Coordination with Clark County Public Works
- Hydrologic and hydraulic analysis
- Addition/modification of regional facilities
- Cost Estimates
- Final Document and Adoption
