October 2022, the town of Searchlight used 3.63 million gallons of water. A reduction of 1.95 MG

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Rural systems operator and customer care staff will continue to reach out to customers that appear to have leaks. No major leaks or issues to report.

Searchlight water system total connections and capacity for possible growth.

Total connections = 335

Active connections = 288

There are approximately 90 available new 5/8 single family connections. As it pertains to other possible growth, commercial / industrial developments, each project needs to be evaluated individually regarding its anticipated water needs.
