7.3. MOBILE SOURCE EMISSIONS BUDGET

Under Section 176(c) of the Clean Air Act, transportation plans, programs, and projects in maintenance areas that are funded or approved under Title 23 of the U.S. Code or the Federal Transit Act must conform to the on-road MVEBs specified in the applicable SIP. 40 CFR 93.118 provides the criteria and procedures for MVEBs.

The MVEB establishes a cap on motor vehicle-related emissions that cannot be exceeded by predicted transportation system emissions. The emissions budget applies as a ceiling on emissions in the year for which it is defined and for all subsequent years until a different budget is defined for another year or a SIP revision modifies the budget. Without a clearly indicated intent otherwise expressed in the SIP, the estimate of future transportation network emissions used in the milestone or attainment demonstration acts as the MVEB.

The emissions analysis for conformity determinations must include emissions from the entire transportation network within the nonattainment area. In the case of Las Vegas, the nonattainment area encompasses both the air quality modeling domain and the transportation planning domain.

The decision on what years to propose for the CO MVEB is a joint policy call between various stakeholders, state and federal transportation agencies, and state and local air quality agencies. One choice is to identify motor vehicle emissions in the year of the next conformity finding (2006) and maintain the budget for all subsequent analysis years (i.e., the interim year conformity analyses, the horizon year, and all years beyond the horizon year). In the case of Las Vegas, that would mean a total domain budget of 623 TPD in the initial 2006-2009 time frame.

Table 7-1 reflects the calculated MVEBs based on MOBILE6.2 in this 2005 CO SIP revision. Section 6 and Appendix A of this SIP revision provide specific information on how these multiyear budget values were derived; DAQEM determined that it would be more accurate to establish multiyear budgets for modeling. The MVEBs in Table 7-1 are the budgets Clark County proposes for EPA approval and, subsequently, for RTC use in making conformity determinations for the next RTP.

That the Board of County Commissioners approve, adopt, and authorize the Chairman sign an amended resolution adopting the 2005 Carbon Monoxide State Implementation Plan Revision, as amended; authorize the Director or her designee to submit the amendor Plan Revision to the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection for U.S. Environment Protection Agency approval, or take other action as appropriate.

FISCAL IMPACT:

None by this action.

BACKGROUND:

After a public review and comment period and a public hearing, the Clark County Board of County Commissioners adopted the Las Vegas Valley Nonattainment Area Carbon Monoxide State Implementation Plan (CO SIP) Revision in October 2005. This CO SIP revision was prepared in order to update carbon monoxide motor vehicle emissions budgets (MVEB) for use in transportation conformity determinations.

The U.S. EPA has reviewed the plan and expressed a concern in one area regarding the adopted future year motor vehicle emissions budgets. The budget for 2030 was developed using projected future emissions, including emissions for McCarran Airport. Budgets for years prior to 2030 were supported by specific hot spot model simulations that demonstrated airport emissions would not cause an exceedance of the CO standard. A modeled hot spot simulation is not available for 2030, and although airport emissions were considered in the regional Urban Airshed Model simulations, the lack of a specific hot spot analysis for 2030 became an EPA concern. Considering the EPA concern, and given the reliability and adequacy of the budgets adopted for the years through 2020, staff recommends the best course of action is to remove the 2030 motor vehicle emissions budget from the CO SIP Revision and request that EPA approve the CO SIP Revision, as amended.

The attached proposed amendment to the CO SIP Revision amends Table 7-1 found on page 7-2 by deleting the 2030 MVEB from the budgets Clark County proposes for EPA approval and, subsequently, for use by the Regional Transportation Commission in future conformity determinations.

Upon Board approval of the attached amended resolution, staff will submit the plan amendment for EPA approval of the Las Vegas Valley Nonattainment Area Carbon Monoxide State Implementation Plan (CO SIP) Revision, as amended.

WHEREAS, the Clark County Board of Commissioners adopted the Las Vegas Valley Nonattainment Area Carbon Monoxide State Implementation Plan in August 2000 to reduce carbon monoxide air pollution levels below national ambient health standards; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency issued a final approval of the August 2000 plan on September 21, 2004, and on June 1, 2005 found that the Las Vegas Valley had attained the carbon monoxide national ambient air quality standard; and

WHEREAS, the mobile source emissions budgets submitted as part of the August 2000 Plan and approved for transportation conformity determinations, were developed using the MOBILE5 model which the U.S. EPA has replaced with an updated, more accurate MOBILE6 model; and

WHEREAS, the 2005 Clark County Carbon Monoxide State Implementation Plan Revision was developed to update the mobile source emissions budgets using EPA's MOBILE6 model in order to provide accurate budgets for use in future transportation conformity determinations;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Clark County Board of Commissioners:

That the Clark County Board of Commissioners adopts the Clark County Carbon Monoxide State Implementation Plan Revision of 2005, as amended.
