- VI. Receive the Director's Report on the Activities of the Department of Juvenile Justice Services a. Budget/Personnel Update
 - i. There are now 3 vacant manager positions; SMYC, Detention, and Probation. The positions posted on January 16 and will remain posted for one month. Thank you Mike Whelihan for the hard work on updating the qualifications for these positions. There will be two rounds of interviews. The first panel will consist mainly of non-County employees. The final interview will be with Jack Martin and Assistant Director Mike Whelihan.
 - **ii.** The next JPO Academy is scheduled to start in March. So far there are thirty candidates going through the process.
 - **iii.** Mr. Martin is budget building supplemental and capital budget requests. He has asked his division managers to make a 'wish list' of items they would like for the fiscal year.
 - b. Legislature No update at this time
 - c. Juvenile Detention Reform
 - i. The new Eastside Probation center has been purchased. The site is located at 4475 S. Pecos Blvd. The projected time frame to occupy the building is 18 months. Evening reporting center (ERC), DJJS Records dept., a school, and another Harbor will be moved into the building when it is ready.
 - **ii.** Real Property Management (RPM) is evaluating contractors for the new Spring Mountain Residential Center (SMRC). The location will be directly east of the existing ERC. RPM says construction will start March.

iii. Because the Family Courthouse building is a shared space between many agencies, the space study is still being completed. Once that is completed, the plans for the new building can begin.

d. Juvenile Justice Programming

- **i.** Manager Cheri Wright is working with Dr. Shawn Marsh to complete a Trauma audit for DJJS that will happen February 20-22. We will then use train the trainer and provide the training to all probation officers and other necessary staff. There will be 6 staff selected as trainers.
- **ii.** Mr. Martin reviewed an academic article about a school in Sacramento that piloted a program with juvenile probation officers stationed in the schools but for SUPPORT, not for a law enforcement component. The program has been active long enough to show successful evidence based results. Mr. Martin would like to start a similar program here in the valley starting with 3 high schools. This will help consolidate the gaps between law enforcement, CCSD, parent involvement, etc.
- **iii.** Caseload Pro is still programming special features and functions into the system and testing. There have been over 2 million lines of data converted from Family Tracks.

e. The Harbor Update

- **i.** Almost 3,000 youth and their families have been serviced at the Harbor since opening October 2017. The escalation into the JJ system has dropped from 6% to 4% which gives the Harbor a 96% success rate.
- **ii.** The Harbor will move into its new location January 22. It is located at 861 N. Mojave Rd., Las Vegas, NV 89101. It is scheduled to have 24/7 coverage in the next month.
- **iii.** Eaglequest's bid was chosen for the Request for Purchase (RFP). DJJS will watch for possible new grants to help fund the new Harbor location and assist Eaglequest in its success.

- a. Improve facilities to provide increased security and increased rehabilitative and vocational opportunities
- **b.** Increase programming to improve client outcomes, using evidence based practices and measuring performance Mr. Martin still plans on one day having some type of intake process at each probation center. This will allow youth to have only one probation officer while in the JJ system.
- c. Reduce disproportionate minority contact through the use of targeted strategies and programs
- d. Post juvenile justice transitional services
