In visual art today, words and alphabetic symbols are commonly used independently as graphic visual elements, or to illustrate ideas such as irony, meaning, narrative, enigma, or humor. Empowerment Art! Desert Breeze Community Center

Empowerment Art is currently in the middle of the workshops with chosen artist Vanessa Maciel. Her workshops with the Desert Breeze Community Center youth started Monday at 3pm. Vanessa opens her workshops with an empowering video for the kids, followed by a discussion about empowerment. After the conversation, Vanessa teaches the kids how to create collages to express their feelings about what they spoke about.
