I. <u>OPENING CEREMONIES</u>

Ms. Jacqueline Ingram, Chairperson, called the meeting to order and led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

IV. Review and discuss HOME Investment Partnerships Program/Affordable Housing Trust Fund (HOME/AHTF) project applications, funding and program requirements (Ofelia Monje)

Ofelia Monje, Grants Coordinator, briefly discusses programs from the previous five years that were funded by the CDAC committee. In terms of the HOME application requirements, one application is a CHODO and must be allocated a minimum of 15%. Clark County funding priority focuses on new development, multifamily new development and rehab. All of the applications received fit the requirements for Clark County.

V. ACTION – Select FY 2020-2021 HOME Investment Partnerships Program/Affordable Housing Trust Fund (HOME/AHTF) projects for recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners.

After ballots were counted, an overall priority ranking based on committee scoring was displayed overhead.

Discussion and deliberations ensued with members making motions and approving final recommendations for funding HOME/AHTF projects 2020-2021, as follows:

VI. Review and discuss Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program and discuss the CDAC ESG ad-hoc committee, FY 2020-2021 ESG project applications, funding and program requirements (Tameca Ulmer)

Tameca Ulmer, Grants Coordinator, discusses how five members of CDAC and five members of CoC merged together and became the sub-committee to evaluate the ESG applications.

VII. Discuss FY 2020-2021 ESG projects for recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners (Chris Darling)

Chris Darling discussed the ESG projects that were elected for funding and the two projects that were not recommended for funding. The most important factors in the election process were providing care for domestic violence, keeping families intact, and the youth. Chris further discusses funding amounts for each project and the requirements for ESG and Rapid Rehousing.

VIII. Wrap up of grant application season and process (Kristin Cooper, Jasmine Carr)

Kristin Cooper, Assistant Director, wraps up the process by first giving a thank you to all committee members for all of their time and effort during the CDAC process. Jasmine Carr, Grants Coordinator, reminds all members of the travel reimbursement forms that can be completed. She also discussed the public hearing for the CDAC selections, which will take place in March or April.
